

C. Reid Ross Scholarship and Annual Grant for Prospective Educators

2025 Application

This application supports the selection of a graduating senior from either Harnett Central or Western Harnett High School who wishes to become an educator. Every four years, a recipient of the "C. Reid Ross Scholarship for Prospective Educators" is awarded a \$1500 scholarship which is <u>renewable annually</u> for three additional years (\$6000 total over four successive years). The applicant may elect to attend a 4yr institution or take the community college route to become an educator.

In addition to the renewable award, and in cooperation with the North Carolina Community Foundation, one recipient who wishes to become an educator will be awarded a one-time \$1000 grant.

Applicants electing to take the community college route should be enrolled in either the Associate in Arts or Associate in Science Teacher Preparation programs at CCCC. (See https://www.cccc.edu/curriculum/majors/universitytransfer/teacher-preparation/).

IMPORTANT NOTES:

The Reid Ross Scholarship for Prospective Educators is a four-year renewable scholarship and must be re-authorized by the Club's Scholarship Committee each year. The Reid Ross Scholarship Grant is a one-time, annual non-renewable award.

- 1. Attend and make satisfactory annual progress toward completion of your education at a four-year college or qualified educational institution.
- 2. Continue your enrollment in a program culminating in a Bachelor's degree in Education.
- 3. Maintain a GPA of 2.75 or greater [YOU must submit a copy of your transcript AND a written request for release of the subsequent year's funds to the scholarship committee of the Rotary Club of Lillington by June 30th of each year.] Failure to do so will result in forfeiture of the scholarship. Not required for the one-time grant.
- 4. Take part in community service and school activities each year and submit a list of such service and activities annually to the Scholarship Committee. Not required for the one-time grant.
- 5. Renewable award requires the recipient to attend at least one of the meetings of the Rotary Club of Lillington each year and briefly speak to the club about your college and community service experience. Both awards require the first visit be made before the end of the calendar year in which the award is received.



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The minimum standard for the renewable award to receive the second, third, and fourth year's funds are as follows:

If the renewable-award recipient is unable to meet these requirements for receiving this scholarship after each succeeding year, then the recipient will not be eligible to receive future scholarship funds and they will be committed to another student.

It will be the duty of the Administrator of the Reid Ross Scholarship Committee, upon receipt of the Ross Scholar's transcripts demonstrating achievement of a 2.75 GPA or greater, to coordinate with the North Carolina Community Foundation for the release of the succeeding year's funds to the Financial Aid Office of the student's college or university, with the full name of the student for which funds are being disbursed, the student's school ID number, and the amount authorized.
